## Newman's Own Foundation Donates Over \$500,000 to Kiwi Charities \$300,000 Going to Disaster Relief

Newman's Own Foundation, the independent foundation created by the late actor and philanthropist Paul Newman, today announced over \$500,000 in grants to be donated to New Zealand charities.

Newman's Own Foundation CEO, Robert Forrester made the announcement at a charity event in Auckland today on his first ever visit to New Zealand.

The funds will be divided into three categories:

- Community groups affected by devastating Christchurch Earthquakes.
- Charities New Zealand wide seeking funding up to \$20,000 for special projects.
- Newman's Own Foundation Community Partner's Programme

"We recognise the needs of communities, especially following natural disasters and emergencies," said Forrester. "Paul was committed to helping make the world a better place. He believed in sharing his good fortune with those in need. He donated to charity all net profits and royalties after taxes from the sale of Newman's Own products. Newman's Own Foundation continues this philanthropic tradition."

The Foundation has made over 99 individual grants to charities in New Zealand since 1992. Recent recipients include Arthritis NZ, Heart Children NZ, Age Concern and Street Football Aotearoa.

Since the Foundation began in 1982, Paul Newman and Newman's Own Foundation have donated more than US\$300 million to charities around the world.

The 2011 NZ charity recipients will be announced late November, 2011.
